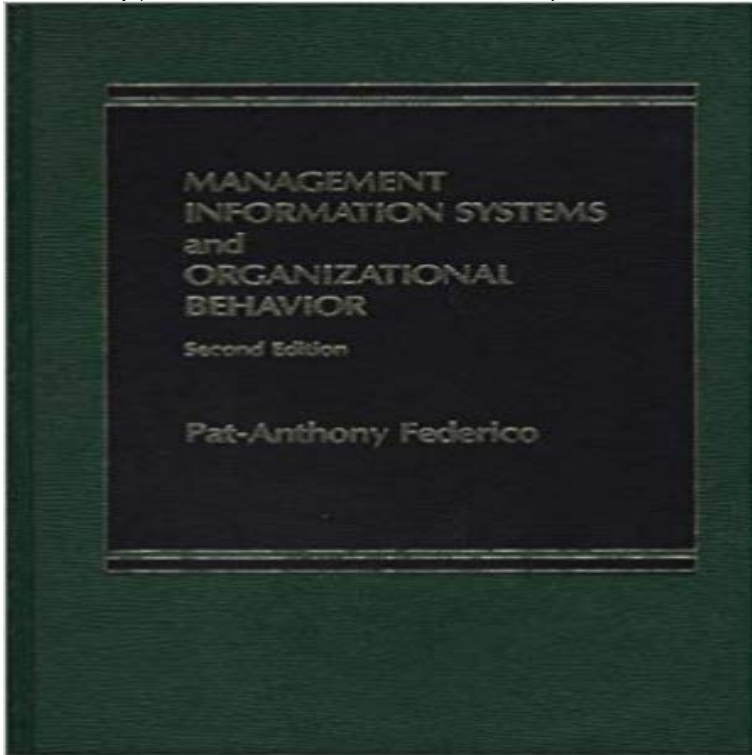


Management Information Systems and Organization Behavior
